Suicide prevention model and its aplication in the municipalities of Lithuania









Suicide rate in Lithuania is 26.4 (per 100000, Health Information Centre of Institute of Hygiene, Lithuania 2018), one of the highest in the world.

It translates to 1018-748 deaths by suicide every 2011-17 year in the country with 2.848 (2017) millions of inhabitants.

What was and is being done?

In 2014 District 1462 initiated long term Suicide prevention program, in 2015 organized District conference "The role of contemporary leader in the prevention of suicides" and adopted resolution unanimously "For the more active and varied action solving the problem of suicides in Lithuania".

Local Rotary clubs were asked to engage with the leaders of the Municipalities where the suicide rate during last 6 years has been the highest. 11 municipalities were selected based on suicides statistical data from 2011-2016 and the initiative of local administrations and Rotary clubs to participate in the Global Grant project. This resulted in the signature of MOU with 11 cooperating organizations (Municipalities), where the roles of Municipality, local Rotary club, District 1462 and International partner (District 2305) are described and anchored.



Since 2018 SEP 01 two year long GG1743565 project "SUicide PREvention ModEl and its Application In the Municipalities of Lithuania" is implemented.

What is SUPREME AIM solution?

Developing the local community-based suicide prevention model (SPM) derived from the algorithm of communication and cooperation among the local institutions at the front line of suicide acts, attempts and intentions with the help of the experts from academic institutions and psychologists with European qualification standard (EuroPsy).

How is it funded?

The funding of the budget 91700 USD was secured from 26 entities, including DDF's from D1462 (Lithuania), D2305, D2290 (Norway), D2240 (Czech and Slovak republics), special account for suicide prevention of D1462 and Rotary clubs from Lithuania (Druskininkai, Marijampole, N.Akmene, Anyksciai, Kupiskis, Panevezys, Pasvalys, Silute, Taurage, Ukmerge, Vilkaviskis, Kaunas, Klaipeda Concordia 1826), Norway (Fraena, Gjovik), Poland (Bartoszyce – Lidzbark Warminski, Gizycko, Olsztyn, Sopot International), Latvia (Riga Ridzene) and USA (Howard West) with 37900 USD part from TRF.

How does it work?

Step 1.

Research of the situation in selected Municipality, drafting SPM based on findings and local medical resources. Creating Suicide Prevention Management Group with involvement representatives from Municipality administration and front line institutions.

Step 2.

Implementing **SPM** in Municipality by a series of structured training addressed to the persons representing front line institutions (police, healthcare, education, social care, fire brigade, emergency,

Municipality administration, church) as well as local communities (elderships) and NGOs enabling them to act in an effective and coordinated way in suicide related emergency situations.



Step 3.

After 6 months organize follow-up for persons involved in trainings, revise SPM and present for approval by the Council of the Municipality.



Step 4.

Organize psychological help to inhabitants, families, relatives in risk situations or after suicide happens with involvement of local medical professionals.

Beneficiaries

Inhabitants (total lives 353 110) in 99 elderships with functioning suicide prevention system and improved access to psychological help.

Society of Lithuania changing approach to suicides, prevention and understanding that **supreme aim is** "suicide can be prevented".
